SS-EN 50110-2 skall användas tillsammans med SS-EN 50110-1.

SS-EN 50110-2 innehåller en lista med normativa nationella bilagor till SS-EN 50110-1. I dessa bilagor anges de myndighetsföreskrifter och andra nationella regler som i respektive land behandlar skötsel av elektriska starkströmsanläggningar och som skall användas tillsammans med SS-EN 50110-1.

Till standarden bifogas också ett Corrigendum, april 1997, som rör myndighetsföreskrifter i Finland.

Foreword

This European Standard was prepared by the CENELEC BT Task Force 62-3 "Operation of electrical installation". The text of the draft was submitted to the formal vote and was approved by CENELEC as EN 50110-2 on 1996-07-02.

Introduction

The standard consists of two parts. The first part EN 50110-1 contains Minimum Requirements valid for all CENELEC countries and some additional informative annexes dealing with safe working. The second part EN 50110-2 consists of a set of normative annexes (one per country) which specify either the present safety requirements or give the national supplements to these Minimum Requirements at the time when this standard was prepared.

The national annexes (if any) are summarized by the respective member country.

National Committees shall notify CENELEC of any changes needed to their national annex.
